# Welcome to Kingsgate School



Kingsgate School is a new family run independent specialist school, with a leadership team who have an excellent reputation for providing the highest quality of education, therapy, welfare and support. We welcome boys and girls aged 7 to 14 who have social, emotional and mental health difficulties as well as other complex needs often associated with autistic spectrum conditions and learning difficulties.

Kingsgate School provides bespoke education provision for up to 16 students who have an EHCP (Educational, Health, Care Plan) and come from local families, foster placements, or local children's homes. We understand that students will arrive at the school with challenging behaviours or an inability to cope in a mainstream school placement. Many of them will have encountered negative educational experiences or disruption, and consequently lack confidence in their own abilities.

We offer a safe and nurturing environment combined with high staff to student ratios, to ensure that every student at Kingsgate School has the opportunity to develop their abilities, share new experiences and to become independent learners. We believe education should be a positive and enjoyable experience, where students feel safe and secure, are proud of their achievements and strive to be an active part of the school and wider community. We actively seek to transition students back to local authority provisions when they are ready and confident to thrive in those learning environments.

Above all, we want all students at Kingsgate School to be happy and successful learners, who will make good progress and achieve.


### Curriculum

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
# Supporting students in their learning

The provision a student receives at Kingsgate School is fully matched to their needs.

The level of support and intervention a child receives is based upon their level of need. The school's Senco coordinates the Learning and development support programmes linking closely with the school's Educational Psychologist.

Through a robust monitoring system we are quickly aware of any changes in students, or any new areas of need that will need to be supported.

We aim for all students to become successful, confident, independent learners. However, we realise that for some this may take time and much support.



### Student centred

The curriculum at Kingsgate School is tailored to individual needs and helps students become:

- Successful learners who enjoy learning, make good progress and achieve
- Confident individuals, able to live safe, healthy and fulfilling lives.
- Responsible citizens who make a positive contribution to their local and wider community.



This approach to the curriculum planning ensures that each student is at the centre and the curriculum and services they require is tailored to meet their individual needs.

Each student is supported in identifying and achieving their ambitions through effective transition planning and a comprehensive careers service including support from an independent careers advisor. Students are encouraged to voice their views regarding their provision and are involved in setting their own development targets to enable them to realise their short and long term goals.

Kingsgate School encourages students to develop their learning, leadership and independence skills through a well-balanced curriculum offering academic, creative, practical, vocational and physical experiences. Embedded within the fabric of Kingsgate School is the Social, Moral, Spiritual and Cultural development of each student.

There is a strong emphasis on learning outside of the classroom, making the most of the local facilities and the South Downs. We have developed strong links within our local community with local colleges, businesses, charities and sport centres.

### Outdoor Education

All students have the opportunity to take part in a wide range of activities including:

Trampolining, Horse riding, Golf, Sailing, Fishing, Climbing, Skiing, Snowboarding, Ice skating, Kayaking, Sailing, Swimming, Orienteering, Forest walking, Mountain biking.

- LOtC Learning out of the classroom, all students will have various opportunities of taking part in Forest Schools, visiting local and national museums, special sporting events, and taking part in outdoor adventurous activities.
- Residential trips taking in a wide variety of locations including the South Downs and the New Forest.

### A good start is key...

At the start of a placement at Kingsgate School, all children will access the following assessment programme which is used to clarify the needs and ability of the child, and to inform their individual therapeutic support and interventions programme:

- Cognitive and Adaptive Behaviour assessments from the school's Educational or Clinical Psychologist
- Academic baseline assessments to ensure teachers understand the starting point of the student including a full review of previous reports and data.
- Screening assessments from the Speech and Language Therapist and the Occupational Therapist (full assessments will follow if significant concerns come from the screenings)
- Holistic development baseline screening after first 6 weeks.
- Social skills assessment
