Vision

Parent /Carer engagement has a positive impact on pupil achievement. At Kingsgate School, pupils are supported and inspired to learn in a culture of high expectations in which parents:

- Are welcomed, respected and valued as partners by the school community in their children's learning and development
- Have opportunities to enable them to be involved and support pupil success
- Are engaged through on-going communication and dialogue to support a positive learning environment at home and at school

What We Know about Parent Engagement

Parents/Carers play a vital role in the development and education of their children.

Research clearly indicates that good schools become better schools when there is a strong connection with parents/carers as part of the learning community. Parents/Carers have a primary influence on their child's attitudes towards school, their learning, and their future success.

"Parent involvement programmes that are effective in engaging diverse families recognise, respect, and address cultural and class differences."

"Parent programs and interventions work best when the strategies respect the needs of families. When school staff engage in caring and trusting relationships with parents that recognise parents as partners in the educational development of children, these relationships enhance parents' desire to be involved and influence how they participate in their children's educational development."

Fulfilling the Vision of Parent Engagement

The Parent/Carer Engagement Partnership Policy recognises that parent/carer involvement is multi-dimensional and that parents/carers have a role to play in fulfilling each of our core priorities for educational excellence.

Strategies for Success

The Parent/Carer Engagement Policy identifies a series of key strategies designed to support parents/carers as partners so that they have the opportunity - and the skills, knowledge and tools- to engage with all education partners in fulfilling our core priorities for education.

Strategy 1: School Climate

Foster and sustain a positive, welcoming school climate in which all parent/carer perspectives are encouraged, valued and heard.

Strategy 2: Eliminating Barriers

Identify and remove barriers to parent/carer engagement that may prevent some parents/carers from fully participating in their children's learning and to reflect the diversity of our pupils and communities.

- Flexible with regards meetings;
- Phone calls to follow up letters (Literacy concerns);
- Dedicated staff to contact families.

Strategy 3: Tools and Supports for Parents

Helping parents/carers support pupil learning at home and at school.

- Phone calls;
- Home visits;
- Academic reports throughout the academic year;
- Open afternoon/evenings;
- Reward celebrations;
- Newsletters;
